





Hidden costs of energy supply



The true costs of electricity are only partly reflected by market or retailer prices.

- → Social costs, and
- → subsidies or other state support,...
- ... are not visible on the bill.




Little typology of subsidies

Subsidies with budget effect		Subsidies without budget effect	
(A) financial transfers	(B) tax benefits / exemptions	(D) external costs	(C) regulation with subsidising effects
Examples from the energy sector			
-Direct financial transfers, e.g. coal sector -Grants to stimulate investment -R&D expenditure -Ecological restoration of coal mines	-Reductions or exemptions from energy taxation -Exemption from royalties	-Climate change costs resulting from emissions of greenhouse gases -Natural degradation through pollution -noise, radiation	-Benefits of emissions trading -Feed-in tariffs ("EEG-surcharge") -Nuclear energy: decommissioning funds regulation
Narrow definition of subsidies		Broad definition of subsidies	




Subsidies for nuclear energy, hard coal, lignite and renewables 1970-2012 (total, 2012 prices)






Subsidies for nuclear energy, hard coal, lignite and renewables 1970-2012 (cumulated, 2012 prices)






Specific subsidies for nuclear energy, hard coal, lignite and renewables 1970-2012 (ct/KWh, 2012 prices)






Social costs of electricity in 2012
